5.1 Grading system of the Institution

Course Load per Semester:

30 ECTS (European Credit Transfer System), that means in average 4 courses.

Grading:

A student's workload is measured in ECTS credits. According to Dutch law, one credit represents 28 hours of work and 60 credits represents one year of full-time study. The grading system used in the Netherlands is on a scale from 1 (very poor) to 10 (outstanding). Grading scales are generally absolute, as opposed to sliding scales in which students are measured against each other in terms of achievement. In the Netherlands a student needs at least 5.5 (out of 10) to have a (bare) pass. The following table compares the Dutch with the ECTS grading systems.

Dutch Grade	ECTS-Grade	Definition
8 - 10	A	Excellent
7 - 8	В	Very Good
6 - 7	С	Good
6 - 6.4	D	Satisfactory
5.5 - 6	E	Sufficient
< 5.5	F	Fail

When nu numerical mark is give, 'v' or *voldoende* and 'o' or *onvoldoende*, indicate 'satisfactory' and 'unsatitisfactory' respectively. *Vrij* or *Vrijstelling* indicates exemption.
