	However, exchange students are not required to follow the prescribed modules for a particular degree course, but may choose from across our Module Catalogue subject to availability and fulfilling any pre-requisites:

	Using the module catalogue you may search by subject or School. Once in the module descriptor you will be able to see if a module is offered in trimester 1 (autumn), 2 (spring) or both.
	The undergraduate degree at Edinburgh Napier lasts 4 years. Incoming exchange students may only select undergraduate level modules, ie those listed as SCQF level 07-10 (= Years 1-4). They may not select modules at level SCQF 11 (postgraduate level).
	Please be aware there are restrictions on certain modules, and acceptance on modules outwith the subject area of the Erasmus+ agreement is at the discretion of the relevant School.
	We cannot guarantee that students will be able to study every module of their choice, and in some cases final module selections will be confirmed upon arrival at Edinburgh Napier. It is therefore recommended that students take the time to consider alternative module choices.

Insurance	We provide the same level of protection to exchange students as is provided to students normally enrolled here.

The university can provide a letter for students to register with a local medical practice. There is not normally a charge for general healthcare and prescriptions. Eye tests are free in Scotland, but dental care will be subject to a charge. An NHS [National Health Service] dentist will charge less than a private dentist.
