

PREREQUISITES AND SELECTION CRITERIA FOR THE AWARD OF ERASMUS+ SCHOLARSHIPS BY THE SCHOOL OF MATHEMATICS, PHYSICS AND NATURAL SCIENCES FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2020/21.

Destinations are assigned according to a ranking drawn up using a scoring system based on an assessment of the student's university career, language knowledge and reasons for studying abroad. The scores are assigned on the basis of the following tables:

Enrolment year

Points	5	3	27	-1
Year	First Degree: Year II, Year III, Specialisation Degree or Master's Degree	First Degree: Year I	Doctoral and Specialisation Students	For each supplementary year

Number of exams taken

0.1 points will be awarded for each credit gained. For Master's Degrees and Doctorates, the credits gained will be added to the ones gained in previous cycles.

Average of marks for exams taken

The average is rounded upwards. E.g. from 24.6 to 25 = 10 points. E.g. from 25.1 to 25.5 = 11 points. The average is calculated using the self-certifications supplied by students.

For the Master's Degree, if educational credits have not yet been gained, the average of credits gained in the first degree course will be considered. For the Doctorate, the average mark will not be considered as it is already included in the points assigned for the year of enrolment.

Language knowledge

The following points are assigned for the self-certification of language knowledge, exclusively for English and/or the language of the destination country:

Certification	Points
• Level A1 or equivalent	1
• Level B1 or PET	2
• Level B2 or FIRST	3
• Level C1 or higher	4

Minimum number of exams passed (regardless of which exams they are, the theoretical maximum and the number of CFUs)	<p>a) Students on first degree courses can only go for a whole year (not for a semester only).</p> <p>b) At the time they submit an application, students on first degree courses must have gained 17 CFUs [university credits] (if they intend to undertake a period of Erasmus study in the second year) or 56 CFUs (if they intend to go in their third year, first semester); no restriction if they intend to go in the second semester of the third year.</p>

Minimum ratio between the number of CFUs [university credits] actually gained and the total number of CFUs the student could have gained when completing the application	50%** **: students enrolled for the first year of a master's degree course are exempt from this requirement
